Dear Parishioners et al,

Anne has put the booklet I mentioned in last month's Newsletter named '*Think Ahead*' on order and it should be with us in due course. I am delighted to see the uptake of the previous dozen or so.

Ministry: At ordination to the <u>deaconate</u> in the Church of Ireland, the bishop says "Because none of us can bear the weight of this ministry in our own strength, but only by the grace and power of God......"

At the ordination to the <u>priesthood</u> the bishop says "Your ministry will be one of joy as well as of responsibility, of happiness as well as of diligence. Yet remember in your heart that if it should come about that the Church, or any of its members, is hurt or hindered by reason of your neglect, your fault will be great and God's judgement will follow. So pray constantly for his mercy and for the grace you will need to fulfil your call."

I share with you that getting the balance right amidst the ever increasing volume of often demanding bureaucracy is a challenge,- and quiet time and prayer can so easily be relegated, - and as day follows night, one's ministry becomes a heavy weight, daily, - and also during the small hours.

I subscribe to the Protestant belief that through Christ we have been given direct access to God, just like a priest; thus the doctrine is called **the priesthood of all believers.** God is equally accessible to all the faithful, and every Christian has equal potential to minister for God.

Thus, in this theme, Sunday 26th March after 11.00 hrs worship, we will hold the Easter Vestry, which this year will include Triennial Elections. i.e. Elections of Lay Members:-

Church Wardens & Glebe Wardens

Members of the Select Vestry (for a period of one year)

Diocesan Synod (which meets annually in October) (for a period of three years) Parochial Nominators. (for a period of three years) If the rector departs within that period, then four of the Parochial Nominators will be charged with the responsibility of researching and 'sniffing out' what they consider to be a suitable rector for Rathmichael Parish. The process includes prayerful discussion with the Diocesan Nominators under the chairmanship of the Archbishop.

The call to be elected as a Parochial Nominator is certainly not a light one.

St. PATRICK'S DAY: There will be a service of Holy Communion at 11.00 hrs on St. Patrick's Day.

PLUS, there will be a Coffee Morning/Afternoon following at the Rectory to 15.00 hrs in aid of the Dementia Programme in St. Joseph's Centre Crinken Lane, (St. John of God Hospitaller) and where I am the Church of Ireland Chaplain. The Coffee "Afternoon" hopefully will aid Hayley Appelbe's sponsorship as she takes part in "Dancing with the Stars" – a la Shankill, rather than a la Telly.!! (See Page 7)
