Dear Parishioners et al,

One may not immediately think of the comedic character John Cleese (Basil Fawlty) as a worrier who suffers from the presence of the 'black dog' in his life. His marriage record is of biblical and Middle Eastern proportions with his first three wives being healthy and well and rich when he married for the fourth time in 2012.

John Cleese and Psychiatrist Robin Skynner wrote the book *"Life and how to Survive it"*. Skynner was a Royal Air Force (RAF) pilot who flew the Mosquito twin-engine bomber, and was also a psychiatric pioneer and innovator in the field of treating mental illness - so I guess he knew a tad about life.

As I struggle to understand the core of fanaticism, be it white supremacism, neo-Nazism, apartheid, Ku Klux Klan, The Crusades, ISIS, and Taliban who wish to eradicate the infidel, Protestant, Catholic and 'might is right' and so on and on, a sentence in the book jumped out at me. "*If people can't control their emotions then they have to start trying to control other people's behaviour*". Do please check out this theory in the light of very strong church influence and control in Ireland over a long period led by men and women who may wittingly or unwittingly have struggled with their emotions. The pressure cooker eventually blows its safety valve, but God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit is kept at arm's length. The currency of love is devoid.

John Cleese, like many other high profile people of late has let air and permission into many lives by being very public about his struggle with mental health.



He would acknowledge that of the many reasons for 'going under' the drain of displaying a range of persona in a multitude of circumstances and rarely, if at all, living in one's own skin can lead to overwhelm.

I guess he could always share with the missus. But which one??

For all the mistakes the church made or makes, the Good News of Jesus Christ is there as is he in our lives. For me Deuteronomy 33:27 "*The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms*" holds a perfectly comforting imagery. I am not so easy with the rest of the verse however. Ouch! But as I see it, Jesus updated and ameliorated some of the harsher Old Testament views of God.

As I write the Parish & School Fete on the 2nd of September looms large. Increasingly and in common with many organisations we have a struggle with volunteerism. Some very reliable stalwarts who have been there for the long and faithful road are now acknowledging stiffer joints and tired bones for some reason.

Perhaps individualism is a factor in our difficulty in getting volunteers, I don't know. But I do know that for building up strong friendships which will see you and yours through thick and thin, getting stuck in and enjoying sweating it out with others is the perfect method. It's the best return on your investment you are ever likely to get. Honest.
