Dear Parishioners,

I write just days after the discovery of Jastine Valdez's body not far from here. Naturally, parents' concern for their young becomes accentuated when such evil calls close to one's door.

"Bear" Grylls is a Northern Irish adventurer, Chief Scout, writer and television presenter. He served in the British Army with 21 SAS as a trooper trained in unarmed combat, desert and winter warfare, survival, climbing, parachuting, and explosives.

In anyone's language he is an interesting character who said the following:

"I really, desperately have learnt in my life that I need my faith, and I'm just not strong enough on my own. I try to start every day by kneeling down and saying, 'Lord Jesus, I ain't got it all right, and I'm nervous about today. I will give it my all, but will you help me?' It's never more complicated than that."

Bear Grylls has become 'the face of the **Alpha** study program on the Christian Faith.

Why do I mention him? Well, whilst my girls mock me when I tell them of this his strategy for dealing with physical assault, I still harp on about it. Our Debbi lives in the inner city about 25 minutes walk from her work in The National Maternity Hospital, and her dad wants her to have every possible method of defence attuned should she need it.

What does this good Christian man Bear Grylls recommend when being attacked?

"Put your hands out to hold an aggressor at bay. If they enter that space, push them out with a loud dominant command: "Back away!" If they attempt to enter your space again, you strike, because that person wants to hurt you or potentially kill you or your family. (Remember, if all they want is your wallet, then give it. The situation I'm describing here is personal and much more deadly.)

So how do we strike? Fast and accurately, aiming for the soft part of the throat. Keep punching and moving forward, continually striking until the threat goes down.

Remember, you will never win a defensive fight. Your reactions will never be fast enough to counter an attack. What's more, you are moving backwards. A recipe for defeat.

For women, if you are being overwhelmed, it has been proven that screaming and clawing violently at an aggressor's face is the best way to repel an attack. Never acquiesce. Meet force with an overwhelming force back. Make them think twice. Clawing is instinctive and will help you overcome adrenal freeze."

Okay. Not the typical Rector's letter, but in reality which of us would not be '**red in tooth and claw**' in the face of a threat to our loved ones, and would wish them the skills to protect themselves in an sometimes very cruel world.

Our hearts go out to Jastine's family and her community, the Hennessy family in their confusion and pain, the frontline personnel who too must go home and hold their treasured ones close with deep felt emotion. Not easy.

God bless each one of you and yours near and far, over and over and over.

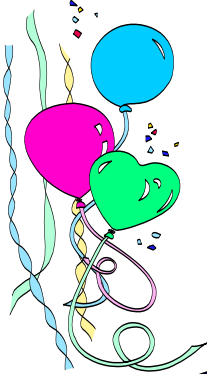
COUNTRY FAYRE STALL at RATHMICHAEL FETE

DATA PRIVACY NOTICE

The Parish of Rathmichael, Shankill, D18 AT22

1. Your personal data – what is it?

Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by the General Data Protection Regulation (the "GDPR").

2. Who are we?

The Parish of **Rathmichael, Shankill, D18 NK45** is the data controller (contact details below). This means it decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes.

3. How do we process your personal data?

The Parish of **Rathmichael** complies with its obligations under the "GDPR" by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; by not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

We use your personal data for the following purposes: -

- To enable us to provide a voluntary service for the benefit of the public in a particular geographical area as specified in our constitution;
- To administer membership records;
- To fundraise and promote the interests of the church;
- To manage our employees and volunteers;
- To maintain our own accounts and records (including the processing of gift aid applications);
- To inform you of news, events, activities and services running Rathmichael Parish;

4. What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

- Explicit consent of the data subject so that we can keep you informed about news, events, activities and services and process your gift aid donations and keep you informed about parish
- Processing is necessary for carrying out obligations under employment, social security or social protection law, or a collective agreement
- Processing is carried out by a not-for-profit body with a political, philosophical, religious aim provided:
 - * the processing relates only to members or former members (or those who have regular contact with it in connection with those purposes); and
 - * there is no disclosure to a third party without consent

5. Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will only be shared with other members of the church in order to carry out a service to other church members or for purposes connected with the church. We will only share your data with third parties outside of the parish with your consent.

6. How long do we keep your personal data?

We keep data in accordance with the guidance set out within Irish Data Protection Legislation, details of which can be found in the guide “Keep or Bin: Care of Your Parish Records” which is available from the Church of Ireland website.

Specifically, we retain electoral roll data while it is still current; gift aid declarations and associated paperwork for up to 6 years after the calendar year to which they relate; and parish registers (baptisms, marriages, funerals) permanently.

7. Your rights and your personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under the GDPR, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data: -

- The right to request a copy of your personal data which Rathmichael Parish holds about you
- The right to request that Rathmichael Parish corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for Rathmichael Parish to retain such data
- The right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time
- The right to request that the data controller provide the data subject with his/her personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability), (where applicable)
[Only applies where the processing is based on consent or is necessary for the performance of a contract with the data subject and in either case the data controller processes the data by automated means]
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing
- The right to object to the processing of personal data, (where applicable)
[Only applies where processing is based on legitimate interests (or the performance of a task in the public interest/exercise of official authority); direct marketing and processing for the purposes of scientific/historical research and statistics]
- The right to lodge a complaint with the Information the Data Protection Commissioner.

8. Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Privacy Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice. The new notice will explain the **new use** of your personal data prior to commencing the processing. It will set out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.
