

#### **RATHMICHAEL IN KENYA**

We are delighted to report that our recent mission trip to Wandeche Parish in Western Kenya was a tremendous success. A group of 12 people from Rathmichael spent over a week in Wandeche School in order to refurbish the facilities and enhance the education experience for the children and provide a better work place for the staff.

It is hard to put into exact words what was witnessed over the course of our time there – the tireless dedication of our team was just something wonderful.

We achieved much more than we set out to accomplish in the week and to give a summary of the work should give you an insight into what happened:

Our team of 12 - consisting of Geoffrey Perrin, Sean Hanily, Fiona Ashe, Robert Gallagher, Aidan Reilly, Peadar Bruton, Jan Ovington, Anthony Perrin, Aine Halligan, Ben Allison, Peter Harty and Simon O'Connor (who was on secondment from Delgany!) – travelled 14815 kilometres to spend 10 days working in the school, whose community is made up of 240 children and 8 teachers. We were helped for part of the week by 7 local labourers. The work carried out was as follows:

Built a kitchen, including stove and storeroom

Guttered 3 buildings each with 1000lt storage tanks for rainwater

Replaced 61 panes of glass

Repaired 54 desks and chairs

4 classrooms, library, staff room and head teachers room painted and stencilled

External of main classroom block painted

14 rooms fitted with lightings and power sockets

External steps fitted to head teacher's office

Holes in the floor of 5 classrooms filled

We are very grateful to everyone in our church community, the wider Shankill community and indeed further afield across the Church of Ireland who so generously supported this worthy cause.

A highlight of the time in Kenya happened on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> August, when the Bishop of Maseno North, the Rt Revd Charles Kascan Asilutwa, came to Wandeche along with a group of dignitaries including the County Minister for Education, to formally dedicate the work to the glory of God. The outcome of that service was that the Minister for Education, so moved by the work carried out, announced that the Dept would now provide a permanent Deputy Head Teacher as well as two extra teaching posts to the school.

Rathmichael's focus on continuing aid to Wandeche will now be focused on delivery of a container of school furniture, the construction of new latrines for the school, and the provision of a substantial breakfast to the children of the school each day. This latter part is of utmost importance, as many of the children come to school on an empty stomach. As well as this, when food is provided at school, this is often the only meal that the children will get in a day – and provision of this ensures that young people stay in education for longer...to the obvious benefit of everyone.

#### RATHMICHAEL AND KENYA

The parish and school are continuing the link with Wandeche school on a number of fronts.

- We are awaiting quotes to rebuild the boys and girls latrines in the
   School. We have enough funds in the Kenya account to complete this.
- We hope to fill a container, or similar secure facility, over the next few months. Already we have a large number of school chairs to transport and will in time advise everybody of other items likely to be useful in Kenya.

#### SCHOOL BREAKFAST SCHEME

More pressing at this stage is raising funds to provide a simple daily breakfast for the youngest children at Wandeche School. Many of these children do not have access to breakfast and walk up to 4km to school. As you can imagine, this greatly affects their concentration in class and their overall well-being. I am looking for names who would be willing to contribute €5 per month (not much more than the price of a cup of coffee!). Your support will enable us to kickstart this breakfast scheme and make a meaningful impact on these children's lives. I have already had quite a few offers but more are needed.






Following on from last years very successful trails, we are looking to do another trail this year. As part of the trail we are looking for the lend or donation of woodland animal garden ornaments.
